Yesterday, I had the privilege of speaking to the leadership and staff of a church in Dallas Georgia. HEARING THE CALL

One of the hardest things in life is the feeling of not knowing your purpose, or calling. I struggled with this for years. Even harder is when others tell you what they think your purpose is; only you don't feel the same passion for the suggestion as they do. Just because you can cook doesn't mean you are called to establish an inner-city soup kitchen. Similarly, just because you feel God calling you to serve Him in some capacity does not mean you should sell everything and head off to seminary and an eventual pulpit somewhere. Don't let this bother you. I can assure you of this, God calls EVERYONE of us to service in His kingdom, not just those who go on to clergy roles. He will reveal His purpose for you if you will be still, ask Him, and then.....wait and listen.

When I first felt Gods calling on my life, I shared these feelings with my wife, Tanya. I said, "I feel God has placed a calling on my life!" She replied, "Wow, doing what?" "I don't know." was all I could reply. I had some ideas, but they were vague and I could not be certain if they were God or me trying to help God out with some suggestions. What I have since learned is that "I don't know" is a perfectly acceptable answer to start with. Don't doubt your call simply because you don't have an answer. That is not your problem, it's God's, and He will solve it in time. Just be patientand pray.

THE PAIN IN YOUR HEART IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR CALL

No person on Earth is without purpose or value in the eyes of God. He created us all in His image, yet uniquely different. We all have things that make us special.
